Educational Freedom would provide a means for re-establishing schools founded by faith communities, allowing parents to partner with a school that aligns with their individual beliefs and values. Teachers and parents would support one another as they united in curriculum and so much more.

All students should be able to say that their favorite teacher was one that shared their family's principles.
