

As school students make their way back into classrooms after their summer break, let us pause to give thanks for Lutheran schools.

On April 26, 1847, twelve pastors representing fourteen congregations and nineteen elementary schools met at St. Paul Lutheran Chicago in Chicago, Illinois, to sign the formal documents that would join them together into what is today called The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. These pastors and their congregations fled Germany seeking the freedom to practice and follow confessional Lutheranism. Thank God for the founders.

It was a priority that each congregation establish elementary schools in order to train the children in the Lutheran faith, educate them in the language and subjects needed for success in life, and to immerse the children in the values of their Lutheran heritage. Although established primarily for the sons and daughters of the congregation, every school openly welcomed children from the neighborhood. Thank God for open doors.

Today the schools of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod remain faithful to these original purposes and open their doors to the children of the neighborhood whose parents want what the Lutheran school offers for their children. Thank God for parents.

Lutheran schools have been a tremendous benefit to the neighborhood, the church, and the state as graduates live out their vocations in service to God and their neighbor as parents, farmers, church professionals, first responders, leaders, and the like. Our country is better with Lutheran school graduates in it. Thank God for graduates.

Today Lutheran schools face a major challenge to their sustainability. It is the high cost of education. Schools faced with increased costs of salaries, benefits, facilities maintenance, technology, utilities, insurance, and other school related expenses raise tuition to the point that they price themselves into extinction. Lack of money forces schools to eliminate grades, services, or their very existence.

There is an answer. It is called "Parental Choice," the continued use of designated education funds that are directed not by bureaucrats, politicians, or school officials, but by the parents of the students. This method whereby designated educational funds follow the students allows for parents to take charge of the education of their children and for those who wish to partake in Lutheran education, insures the future of Lutheran schools.

The Lutheran Center for Religious Liberty asks for your partnership in praying for Lutheran schools and a solution to the obstacles they face. Governmental policies and lack of finances not only diminish Lutheran school opportunities, but also our culture.
